Matching Grant Services

The following MG services are to be provided throughout the 240-day MG service period as necessary.

Provided in-house

Provided in-house or through referral



Case Management

Ensure all program requirements are met and clients receive services as outlined in their Self-Sufficiency Plans.

English Language Training

Enroll all clients in English Language Training at an appropriate competency level. The only exception is for clients who are fully proficient in English.





Employment Services

Provide services to help clients become economically self-sufficient, including job readiness trainings, job placements, post-placement assistance, and referrals for job upgrades.

Employment Training and Recertification

Refer clients to short-term job training courses, customized skills training, or job recertification courses.





<u>Maintenance Assistance:</u> Rent, utilities, food, and transportation until case is self-sufficient.

<u>Cash Allowance:</u> Provided until day 180 or the case is self-sufficient, whichever is sooner.

Health and Medical Services

Ensure clients have access to and receive health and medical services.





Local Administration

Program oversight and administration to ensure services are delivered in accordance with program requirements, employment and program outcomes are achieved, and fiscal requirements are met.

Social Adjustment Services

Refer clients to social adjustment services, such as behavioral health counseling, support groups, and interpretation, as needed.



Support Services

Assist clients in obtaining additional support services that remove barriers to self-sufficiency, including childcare. Barriers should be listed in clients' Self-Sufficiency Plans.
